The Graduate Diploma in Legal Practice (GDLP) prepares you for your legal career with practical legal training (PLT) a compulsory requirement to be admitted as a barrister or solicitor in Australia.

Delivered in partnership with the Law Society of South Australia who are experienced leading members of the judiciary and legal professionals.

The Adelaide GDLP offers:

- An accelerated program which can be completed within 20 weeks whilst working;
- The opportunity to study concurrently while in your final year of your Bachelor of Laws (LLB) (subject to conditions)*

- · Direct local admission as a barrister and solicitor to practise in South Australia;
- The opportunity to build networks and relationships while you learn with South Australian legal professionals;

PROGRAM INFORMATION

If you want to practise law in Australia you need to complete recognised practical legal training.

The Adelaide GDLP program is designed to give you the practical skills required to become a competent legal practitioner.

The GDLP is comprised of:

- 5 mandatory subjects and 2 electives;
- 6 weeks (225 hours) of legal practice. Recent relevant work experience may be used to reduce your required placement hours;
- 5 Continuing Professional Development (CPD) points;
- Some seminars have compulsory attendance but are scheduled at a range of times during the day, evening and at weekends
